## How to ensure your RFID applications are compliant

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A simply checklist to help you achieve compliance for all of your RFID applications



You might not need a sprint start but, with a deadline of 25 May 2018, time is getting short for ensuring your organisation complies with the new GDPR. Your RFID applications are an important part of this. Here we provide a simply checklist to help you achieve compliance for your RFID applications

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1. Accept the need for including your [RFID applications in your GDPR privacy impact assessments](#).
2. Accept the benefits of using the [EN 16571](#) as the framework for your RFID privacy impact assessments.
3. List all of your RFID applications. Note that this needs to include all systems that use radio communication to transmit data and RFID tags to hold data (e.g. contactless payments, staff access cards). We have a [list of RFID applications](#) on our website.
4. Consider whether you have the time to carry out a RFID privacy impact assessment on your own. EN 16571 is quite complex and involved. [This page](#) might help in your decision.
5. Consider whether you have the RFID technical knowledge to complete a RFID privacy impact assessment on your own. A certain level of technical expertise is required to understand the threats, vulnerabilities and counter measures that are relevant to each of your RFID applications.
